Welcome to the EMT Training Funding Program

This guide will help you understand the Training Funding Program that will pay for your Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) training. If you are selected, you will receive FREE EMT Training. As you progress through your EMT training, you will be making decisions as to your future in the Emergency Medical Services field. In some cases, working as an EMT is a necessary step to get where you want to go, like the Fire Service. In other cases, it fits nicely into your academic studies, as it is the perfect college job. Nowhere else can you work full-time hours in fewer than 3 days per week.

So let's get started.



Who's funding this Training?

The California Training Association (CTA) is coordinating this program. CTA along with National Veterans Transition Services, Inc. (NVTSI), Pro-Tech Life Safety Services (Pro-tech), The Academy for Professional Development (AFPD), and the Employment Training Panel (ETP) are cooperating to provide FREE Emergency Medical Technician training to Veterans.

There are Two Tracks into the Program for Funding

Track “A” is for Veterans who are currently receiving Unemployment Benefits.

This is a program for Veterans who are currently receiving Unemployment Benefits or are Eligible for Unemployment Benefits in California. Active Service Members who will be separating from the Military within the next 9 months may also be eligible. Funding for training can be made available after the applicant is certified as eligible for the program. Typically the funding will cover the cost of attending an Emergency Medical Technician Training Program. Upon successful completion of this training, the Veteran should be eligible to take the Federal and State tests to work as an EMT.

Track “B” is for Other Veterans.

Track “B” is different from Track “A” in that the Veteran does not have to be eligible for Unemployment Benefits. Typically these Veterans have been separated from military service for more than 3 years. Upon successful completion of this training, the Veteran should be eligible to take the Federal and State tests to work as an EMT.

We Need Your Commitment to this Training

We need your commitment to this training. There are limited funds available for this program. CTA tries to qualify applicants based on the likelihood that they will follow through with their good intentions to complete the training. The probability that we will have access to future training funds will depend on the number of trainees who successfully complete the training and gain employment. We encourage you to give serious thought to your plans and evaluate your future career objectives. There is no way we can read your mind and determine how committed you really are. Only you can tell if you will complete the training and become an EMT.

We wish you the best of luck in your training and hope that we can help you succeed in your future career endeavors.

THE PROCESS

1. Receive your EMT Class Completion Certificate

You are required to attend class and complete your EMT training. You will receive a Certificate of Completion.

2. Receive your National Registry EMT Certificate (NREMT)

You are required to apply for the NREMT certificate and become certified by the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians. This is the Nation's EMT Certification.

3. Receive your California State EMT Certificate

You are required to apply for the State of California EMT Certificate and become certified by the State of California Emergency Medical Services Authority.

4. Receive your Orange County EMT License

You are required to apply for the Orange County EMT License and become accredited by the County of Orange. You will need County accreditation for the County you work in. Other counties have different requirements.

5. Start Working as an EMT

You will find your new job and start your career as an Emergency Medical Technician.

Employment Opportunities

Upon completion of your EMT training, you may be looking for work as an EMT in either Orange County or Los Angeles County. You may be invited to apply at Care Ambulance Service (CARE).

It is customary for a candidate to be in possession of their EMT County License prior to applying for employment. Usually, an employer requires an EMT applicant to have a County License in hand before applying for a position. This means there can be a significant delay between completion of your classes and starting your job. Even after getting your County License it can take 3-4 weeks to make it through a selection process and to be placed into a New Hire Orientation Class.

CARE has a program called the “Pre-Hire Student Program” that drastically reduces this delay. With this program, you don’t need to wait. You can apply for employment by signing up for their “Pre-Hire EMT Student Program.” When you sign up for the “Pre-Hire EMT Student Program” you will be assigned a Mentor who will be available to you for advice and guidance.

If at any time during your EMT Training, you decide that you would like to work for CARE, you can fill out a “Pre-Hire Application” and submit it to the company. Your application will be reviewed, and you will be contacted for an interview. By utilizing these programs you will be able to reduce the time between the completion of training and starting work.
